### Upcoming Legislative Deadlines

- June 15 Legislature must deliver proposed budget
- June 27 Governor must sign/veto budget
- June 27 Bond must be passed, signed by the Governor and delivered to Attorney General's office
- July 4 August 5- Summer Recess
- August 31- End of two-year legislative session
- September 30 Last day for Governor to sign bills

#### Status of Bond Discussions

- Legislative Working Groups on Climate Bonds in both houses
- Speaker and Pro Tem offices engaged in bond discussions
- ► Two Legislative priorities for bonds: Education and Climate
  - Bonds are tied together both houses must agree on and pass both bonds
  - ▶ Total bond debt between \$15-20 billion
  - Likely \$8-9B Climate Bond
  - Bond needs to be in print by June 20-21 at the latest to be finalized by June 27
- Assembly climate bonds: \$10, \$8, \$6 billion
- Senate climate bonds: \$9 and \$7 billion
- Water sections seem to be around \$3-4 billion

#### Water Section of the Bonds

- ► SB 867 and AB 1567 have similar and robust water sections
  - Safe drinking water, flood management, protection of rivers, lakes, and streams, dam safety, water recycling, etc.
  - Specific amounts for programs vary across the bonds
  - SGMA & IRWM are specifically called out for funding in AB 1567
  - We know that the water chapters will likely remain the largest of the bond chapters due to polling results showing that water is a top priority for voters
