

#### What is the Restoration Authority?

Mission: To raise and allocate resources for the restoration, enhancement, protection, and enjoyment of wetlands and wildlife habitat in the San Francisco Bay and along its shoreline.

- Created in 2008 with legislation
- Mandate: propose new public funding mechanisms & provide grants
- Governing Board, Advisory Board, and Oversight Committee
- No funding to carry out its mission until passage of Measure AA in June 2016





# Clean and Healthy Bay Ballot Measure, "Measure AA": Regional Parcel Tax for Restoration



- June 2016 ballot measure to accelerate Bay wetlands restoration
- Passed with 70% support overall in all 9 counties
  - > 73.50% in Marin
  - 64.30% in Sonoma
  - > 59.13% in Napa
  - > 54.35% in Solano
- \$12/parcel/year for 20 years, ~\$500 million for restoration projects around the Bay
- Complete restoration (100,000 acres)requires ~\$2 billion; leverage



# Eligible Grantees & Project Locations

- Grantees: Public & Private, owners/operators of shoreline parcels. Federal, state, local, and nonprofits
- Locations: Bay shoreline in 9
   Bay Area counties; including
   SF Bay, San Pablo Bay,
   Suisun Bay, and Carquinez
   Strait, (but not Delta Primary
   zone).





#### Eligible Projects: General Activities

- Restore, protect, enhance natural habitats
- Build or enhance flood management (related to habitats)
- Improve or provide public access (related to habitats)




#### Funding for North Bay Projects

- \$25m per year estimated
- \$500m over 20 years
- Up to 5% for admin
- 50% of funds for regional allocation
  - North Bay (Sonoma, Marin, Napa, Solano)
  - 9% = \$45m over 20 years





































Edgerley Island and South Wetlands Opportunity Area









#### Timeline and Next Steps

Board meeting July 29th, 2016; full timeline RFP Release: July 2017 Update Project List: January-March 2017 Proposals Due: September 2017 Grant Awards Made: January 2018.

#### Grant Program Process

- Staff will draft RFP and evaluation guidelines.
- Solicitation is 1-2 times a year.

RFP (Authority Staff)

#### RFP (Advisory Committee)

 Advisory Committee will review RFP and evaluation guidelines.  Authority Board will review RFP and evaluation guidelines; will consider and adopt at a public meeting.

> RFP (Authority Board)

#### Screening (Authority Staff)

- Pre-proposal consultation encouraged.
- Staff will pre-screen proposals using enabling legislation and Measure AA.

 Review by 3 professionals; may include Authority Staff and/or Advisory Committee Members.

> Review (Staff, Advisory, and Professionals)

#### Award (Authority Staff)

- Authority staff recommend projects to board based on criteria, pool of proposals, funds available, urgency, & CEOA readiness
- Authority staff draft report on project consistency.

 Authority Board to review, consider, and approve projects at a public meeting.

Award (Board)

#### Controls (Oversight Committee)

- Annually review conformance with Measure AA
- Review audits and expenditure and financial reports
- Publish an annual report of findings

- Today Jan. 2017: familiarize yourself with Restoration Authority grant processes, and funding criteria and priorities.
- Jan. Mar. 2017: add any projects to list/map
- July 2017: review RFP; pre-proposal consultation; develop proposal
- Sept. 2017: submit proposals

Jan. 2018: awards made

#### Other Ways to Get Involved

- Advisory Committee: assists with grant round, represents community interests and Bay Area geography
  - New members Nov. 2017 Feb. 2018
- Independent Citizens Oversight Committee: keeps controls on Restoration Authority, annual review
  - New members Nov. 2017 Feb. 2018
- Attend Board Meetings
  - Next is October 2017

The **San Francisco Bay Restoration Authority** is a regional government agency charged with raising and allocating resources for the restoration, enhancement, protection, and enjoyment of wetlands and wildlife habitat in the San Francisco Bay and along its shoreline. The Authority was created by the California legislature in 2008 with the enactment of AB 2954 (Lieber). On January 13, 2016, the **Authority's Board** unanimously voted to place a funding measure on the **June 7, 2016 ballot** in the nine-county Bay Area to generate funds to protect and restore San Francisco Bay.
